The agency received a report alleging physical abuse to the 3-year-old on 1/17/13 and was in the process of completing the assessment at the time of the incident. The worker made contact with the 3-year-old and the mother on 1/17/13. The agency did not have any further contact with the family prior to being notified of the incident involving the infant.

On 5/9/11, the agency screened in a referral for services. The family was referred to community services.

On 1/17/13, the agency screened in a report alleging physical abuse to the 3-year-old. Physical abuse was unsubstantiated. The case remains open for ongoing case management services in relation to the incident involving the infant.

Summary of any investigation involving the child, any member of the child's family and alleged maltreater conducted under ch. 48 or ch. 938 and any services provided to the child and child's family since the date of the incident:

The agency screened in and assessed the allegation of physical abuse to the infant. The agency substantiated physical abuse to the infant by an unknown maltreater. The infant and his two siblings were determined to be unsafe and were placed in out-of-home care with relatives. The agency filed Child in Need of Protection or Services petitions and the case remains open for ongoing case management services.

Summary of policy or practice changes to address issues identified during the review of the incident:

Under the Child Welfare Disclosure Act (Section 48.981(7)(cr), Stats.), DSP completes a 90-day review of the agency's practice in each case reported under the Act. In accordance with the DCF memo Series 2010-13, dated December 7, 2010 pertaining to the Child Welfare Case Review Protocol, the Bureau of Performance Management (BPM) completed an on-site review in case # 130205DSP-Milw-292. The review found: BMCW practice in Access was not in compliance with standards requiring consideration of a family's CPS history for the access report under review. BMCW practice in Initial Assessment was not in compliance with standards related to information gathering in Initial Assessment and in the assessment of caregivers identified for a protective plan, and standards related to timely data entry of case work in the eWiSACWIS system.

BMCW revised its Child Welfare Access/Initial Assessment Quality Assurance Plan to incorporate a review of protective plan implementation, documentation, distribution, and monitoring to ensure compliance with policy and standards. BMCW reviewed the standards for the implementation of the protective plan of 1/30/13 with the staff and supervisor, and for data entry in the eWiSACWIS system for staff and supervisor for the Initial Assessment under review.
