Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect: On February 3, 2015, the agency received a report regarding a one-year-old child brought to the hospital with head injuries and bruising on his body. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation regarding the child's suspicious injuries. Medical personnel diagnosed the infant with Physical Abuse - Abusive Head Trauma. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the father's girlfriend was arrested, criminally charged, and convicted with Neglecting a Child, Child Abuse-Intentionally Cause Harm and Child Abuse - Recklessly Cause Great Harm.
Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident: The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the child by the father's live-in girlfriend. The agency found a preponderance of evidence to substantiate neglect to the child by the birth father and birth mother. Medical professionals determined the child sustained injuries and loss of weight from abuse.
The one-year-old child was deemed unsafe and taken into Temporary Physical Custody. Upon discharge from the hospital, the infant was placed in out-of-home care. A Child in Need of Protection or Services petition was filed and the case remains open to provide ongoing case management services.
