On June 5, 2018, the agency received a report of a 5-week-old infant pronounced deceased. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. The Medical Examiner's Office noted no signs of maltreatment or trauma to the infant. No criminal charges have been filed in this case, and the investigation remains open.
Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:
The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the infant by the infant's father. The Medical Examiner's Office noted no signs of maltreatment or trauma to the infant. The infant's 3-year-old sister, 6-year-old brother, and 8-year-old half-brother were deemed safe and remained with the infant's parents. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

The family was referred to community resources and the case was closed upon the completion of the Initial Assessment.

On July 24, 2014, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging unborn child abuse by the infant's mother. An assessment was completed by agency and the allegation of unborn child abuse was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On March 27, 2012, the agency screened-out a CPS Report.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the infant by the infant's father. The Medical Examiner's Office noted no signs of maltreatment or trauma to the infant. The infant's 3-year-old sister, 6-year-old brother, and 8-year-old half-brother were deemed safe and remained with the infant's parents. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment.
