The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the infant and his 2-year-old brother and 5-year-old sister by the mother and the mother's friend. The infant's 2-year-old brother and 5-year-old sister were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in a non-relative foster home. Children in Need of Protection or Services Petitions were filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
