The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the child's father. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the infant had sustained injuries that were non-accidental in nature; toxicology results are pending. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate neglect of the infant by the mother and father. The infant's 6-year-old half-sister was deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody and placed with a relative. A Child in Need of Protection or Services Petition was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
