Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On December 12, 2019, the agency received a report regarding an 11-month-old infant brought to the hospital unresponsive on December 10, 2019. Medical personnel determined that the infant had injuries that were non-accidental in nature. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. On December 12, 2019, the infant was pronounced deceased in the hospital. No criminal charges have been filed in this case, and the investigation remains open.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by his father. Medical professionals determined the infant sustained injuries consistent with non-accidental trauma. The infant's siblings were deemed unsafe, taken into temporary physical custody, and placed in a non-relative foster home. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

On December 10, 2019, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant and his now 3-year-old and 2-year-old siblings by the mother and father. The infant died during the assessment period and an additional report was made to the agency regarding the infant's death on December 12, 2019. An assessment of the allegations was completed by the agency and the initial allegations of neglect were substantiated.

On May 17, 2019, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant and his now 3-year-old and 2-year-old siblings by the mother. The allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated as the agency was unable to locate the family to complete the assessment and the case was closed.

An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegations of neglect were unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On May 26, 2018, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant's now 2-year-old sibling by the mother. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.
