Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect: On 7/9/12, the agency received a report regarding the death of a 4-month-old child two days prior. On the day of the child's death, the father found the child non-responsive in his Pack N Play at approximately 12:15 pm. The parents reported they had been sleeping in an adjacent room to the child. An ambulance was called to the home and the child was transported to a local hospital, where he was pronounced dead. Law enforcement was contacted to investigate the child's death. The cause of death was determined to be suffocation. The Pack N Play where the child was placed to sleep contained several items including blankets and adult size pillows. Criminal charges for obstruction have been referred to the District Attorney's Office for both parents.
Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident: The agency screened in and assessed allegations of neglect to the child, as well as allegations of neglect to the child's 2-year-old half-brother. At the time the agency received the report regarding the child's death, a report was also received regarding the 2-year-old being found wandering outside by police at approximately 1:30 AM. The agency substantiated neglect to the child. The agency determined that the parents continuously put the child to sleep with blankets and pillows and would prop the child's bottle for feeding. Law enforcement determined that on the day of the child's death, there was an approximate nine hour timeframe where no one checked on the child. The parents also admitted to using marijuana during this timeframe. The agency referred the case to juvenile court requesting a Child in Need of Protection or Services petition be filed on behalf of the 2-year-old; however, the mother moved to another county and the District Attorney's Office did not file the petition. A referral was sent to the county where the mother currently resides with the 2-year-old. That county is in the process of completing an assessment on the family.

On 5/31/12, a report was received regarding the 2-year-old found outside unsupervised. The report was referred to another county where the mother was residing at the time. The county screened out the report.

Summary of any investigation involving the child, any member of the child's family and alleged maltreater conducted under ch. 48 or ch. 938 and any services provided to the child and child's family since the date of the incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement to complete the assessment. The agency substantiated neglect to both the child and his 2-year-old half-brother. The 2-year-old was determined unsafe and an in-home safety plan was developed. The agency also referred the case to the District Attorney's Office requesting a Child in Need of Protection or Services petition be filed in juvenile court. The mother moved to another county with the 2-year-old; therefore, the District Attorney's Office did not file the petition. A referral has been made to the neighboring county and they are in the process of completing an assessment on the family.
