Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:  On June 19, 2013, the agency received a referral for alleged sexual abuse and sexual exploitation of a 20 month old child by the child's father. According to the report, the father allegedly recorded himself sexually abusing his 20 month old child on four separate occasions. Medical examination of the child indicated the child did not sustain any physical injuries as a result of these allegations; however during the criminal investigation, the father admitted he had sexual contact with the child on at least 20 occasions.
The father was charged with four counts of 1 <sup>st</sup> Degree Child Sexual Assault-Intercourse with Person Under 12. The father was found guilty of one count of 1 <sup>st</sup> Degree Child Sexual Assault-Intercourse with Person Under 12.
Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:  The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate sexual abuse to the child by his father. The child was determined safe in the care of his mother, who was found to have no awareness of the sexual abuse of her son. Should not be a sexual abuse of her son. Should for divorce and states she has no intention of reconciling with the child's father. The agency filed a Child in Need of Protection or Services petition in Juvenile Court. The case is open for ongoing services.

The agency screened in and assessed the allegation of sexual abuse to the child by the father. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate the maltreatment of sexual abuse to the child by the father. The child remained in the home with the mother and the father was incarcerated. The agency filed a
