Law enforcement vecontacted and initiated a criminal investigation regarding the child's suspicious injuries.	vas
The mother reported she brought the child to the hospital due to respiratory symptoms. The hospital diagnosed the child we bronchitis and gave the mother a prescription. The mother stated when she returned home with the child she was informed hospital found multiple fractures from the x-rays that were just completed on the child. The mother and father returned to hospital with the child. The mother and father were both interviewed and initially reported no knowledge of how the injurcould have occurred. The father subsequently provided several explanations for how the child could have been injurchowever, medical professionals determined none of the explanations given were consistent with the child's injuries.	the the
Medical professionals determined the child had multiple fractures to his arm, leg, clavicle, and ribs with different stages healing. No criminal charges have been filed in this case, but the investigation remains open.	O

The Initial Assessm completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the child father. The child and his sibling were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in out-of-ho care.
