The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of evidence to substantiate physical abuse to the infant by an unknown maltreater, and neglect of the infant by the infant's mother and father. Medical personnel stated the femur break was a high force injury caused by a bending force to the leg. Further, medical personnel stated the infant's condition of failure to thrive was not caused by his medical condition, rather, was non-organic and caused by inadequate calories. The infant was deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in out-of-home care. A Child in Need of Protection and Services (CHIPS) petition was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
