Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On March 4, 2015, the agency received a report regarding a thirteen-year old child who was left by herself in the basement of her home during the evening hours and overnight, without access to a bathroom or running water, and was provided inadequate sleeping arrangements. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation regarding the child's suspicious injuries. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the biological mother and the child's stepfather were criminally charged with Neglecting a Child. A criminal charge is merely an allegation and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the child by the mother and stepfather. The child was deemed unsafe and taken into Temporary Physical Custody. The child was placed with her biological father and grandparents (who resided together). The mother and stepfather were criminally charged. The stepfather was court ordered to have no contact with the child. A Child in Need of Protection or Services petition was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

On June 20, 2014, the agency screened in a Services Reports with concerns related to the child's sleeping conditions. A child welfare assessment was completed and the child was determined to be safe. The case was closed for child welfare services and opened to receive other agency services.

On January 8, 2013, the agency screened in a Services Report for mental health services.

On August 20, 2012, the agency screened in a CPS Report alleging several forms of maltreatment to all children living in the household. The CPS Report alleged physical abuse to the child by her stepfather and the child's sisters by their father. The CPS Report alleged Emotional Abuse/Damage to the child by her biological mother. The CPS Report also alleged sexual abuse to the child by her biological father (who did not live in the home) and sexual abuse of the child's sisters by other siblings in the father's home. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegations of physical abuse, sexual abuse and emotional abuse/damage were unsubstantiated. The children were determined safe and the case was closed.

On May 1, 2012, the agency screened in a CPS Report alleging emotional abuse/damage by the mother to the child and sexual abuse to the child by the biological father (who was not living in the home). An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegations of emotional abuse/damage and sexual abuse were unsubstantiated. The child was determined safe and the case was closed.

On July 22, 2011, the agency screened in a CPS Report alleging sexual abuse to the child by her stepfather. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of sexual abuse was unsubstantiated. The child was determined safe and the case was closed.

On May 27, 2010, the agency screened in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to child by her biological mother. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of physical abuse was unsubstantiated. The child was determined safe and the case was closed.

The CPS Report alleged sexual abuse to the child by her biological father (who did not live in the home) and sexual abuse of the child's sisters by other siblings in the father's home. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegations of physical abuse, sexual abuse and emotional abuse/damage were unsubstantiated. The children were determined safe and the case was closed.

On May 1, 2012, the agency screened in a CPS Report alleging emotional abuse/damage by the mother to the child and sexual abuse to the child by the biological father (who was not living in the home). An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegations of emotional abuse/damage and sexual abuse were unsubstantiated. The child was determined safe and the case was closed.

On December 29, 2011, the agency screened out a CPS Report.

On March 26, 2009, the agency screened in a CPS report alleging sexual abuse to the child by an unknown maltreater. The allegation was unsubstantiated. The family continued to receive agency services through the CHIPS order and the child continued to receive services related to autism through a community agency.

On August 29, 2008, the agency screened in a report alleging physical abuse to the child by the mother's then boyfriend. A joint investigation was completed and the allegations were unsubstantiated. The family continued to work with DHHS through the CHIPS petition and the on-going case management services already in place. The child also continued to receive services related to autism through a community agency.

On April 16, 2008, the agency screened in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to the child by the mother. A joint investigation was completed with law enforcement and the allegation of physical abuse was unsubstantiated; however, concerns of neglect and emotional damage by the mother were assessed during the investigation and were substantiated. The agency filed a CHIPS Petition and the family received Ongoing case management and the child continued to receive agency services related through a community services agency.
