Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:
On August 27, 2017, the agency received a report regarding a 1-year-old infant brought to the hospital with multiple injuries. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical personnel determined that the injuries were consistent with non-accidental head trauma. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the mother's boyfriend was arrested and criminally charged with Child Abuse-Intentionally Causing Great Bodily Harm and First Degree Reckless Injury. A criminal charge is merely an allegation and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.
Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:
The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the mother's boyfriend. Medical professionals determined the infant sustained injuries consistent with non-accidental head trauma. The infant and his siblings were deemed unsafe and taken into Temporary Physical Custody. The infant remains hospitalized an upon discharge will be placed in out-of-home care. The infant's siblings were placed with a relative and later placed into a non-relative foster home. A Child in Need of Protection or Services Petition was filed for all three children, and the case remaine open to provide ongoing case management services.
