An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegations were unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the mother. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. The agency deemed the infant and her sibling unsafe and initiated a Protective Plan. Subsequently, the infant and her half-sibling were taken into Temporary Physical Custody and placed with the infant's father. Child in Need of Protection or Services Petitions were filed, and the infant and her half-sibling were placed with their fathers. The case remains open to provide ongoing case management services. B.
