Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the death was due to an unsafe sleep environment. The criminal investigation remains open.
Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident: The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the death was due to an unsafe sleep environment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate neglect of the infant by the mother and grandmother. The agency deemed the infant's half-siblings safe, and they remained with the mother. The family was referred to community services, and the agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment.
