On April 27, 2018, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to one of the child's now adult siblings by the father. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of physical abuse was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On November 3, 2017, the agency screened-out a CPS Report.

On September 29, 2017, the agency screened-out a CPS Report.

The following history is related to the child's mother: On March 1, 2011, the agency screened-out a CPS Report.

On April 7, 2010, the agency screened-in a Services Report.

On March 17, 2010, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to one of the child's now adult siblings by the mother. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. This report came in when the agency was providing services to the family, and the case remained open for ongoing case management services.

On May 5, 2008, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to one of the child's now adult siblings by the mother. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. This report came in when the agency was providing services to the family, and the case remained open for ongoing case management services.

On October 17, 2006, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the child's now 17-year-old sibling and the child's now adult siblings and half-siblings by the mother and the father. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed on October 24, 2006, for one of the child's now adult half-siblings and three of the child's now adult siblings, and the case remained opened for ongoing case management services.

On July 19, 2006, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the child's now 17-year-old sibling and the child's now adult siblings and half-siblings by the mother. Another report, which was made on October 17, 2006, was received during the assessment period. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed on October 24, 2006, for one of the child's now adult half-siblings and three of the child's now adult siblings, and the case remained opened for ongoing case management services.

On July 20, 2005, the agency screened-out a CPS Report.

On September 17, 2003, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the child's now adult siblings and half-siblings by the mother. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. This report came in when the agency was providing services to the family, and the case remained open for voluntary case management services.

On June 9, 2003, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the child's now adult siblings and half-siblings by the mother and father. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect by the mother to two of the child's now adult siblings was substantiated. This report came in when the agency was providing services to the family, and the case remained open for voluntary case management services.

On May 22, 2003, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to one of the child's now adult siblings by the

mother. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect by the mother to two of the child's now adult siblings was substantiated. The case was opened for voluntary case management services.

On August 21, 2001, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to one of the child's now adult half-siblings by the mother. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Medical Examiner's Office ruled the death a homicide. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the

	evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect and physical abuse to the child by the father. The agency determined the child's siblings safe, and they remained with their mother. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment, and no service referrals were made.
