- Develop YASI booster training.

Data

- Begin standardizing DCF reports and analysis of statewide youth justice data.
- Continue development of the youth specific case management module in eWiSACWIS.
- Incorporate detention data into eWiSACWIS.

Capacity Building through Technical Assistance

- Provide research-based information on best practices to the field.
- · Promote county innovation and evidence-based practices in the field.
- Support peer-to-peer learning opportunities and educate system partners about implementation of the YASI.

Standards

- Implement, test and revise the YASI policy throughout statewide implemention of the tool in practice.
- Review research on diversion to inform future standards.
- Develop resources to support the use of youth justice standards in practice.

Input and Feedback

- Incorporate the work of Youth Leadership Teams to influence DCF policy development and raise awareness of needed system changes.
- Consult with tribal representatives to gather input on tribal youth justice issues and provide opportunities for representation in DCF's youth justice work.
