
• Purpose:






Inclusive Child Care for B-3

- B-5 System: Greater service coordination
- Statewide pilot
 - Initial roll-out August 1
 - Statewide roll-out October 1

Federal Needs Assessment Requirements

Needs Assessment Grant Requirement: Conduct or update a periodic, statewide birth through five (B-5) needs assessment of the availability and quality of existing programs in the state/territory, including programs serving the most vulnerable or underserved populations and children in rural areas; to the extent practicable, the unduplicated number of children being served in existing programs; and, to the extent practicable, the unduplicated number of children awaiting service in such programs.









Long Term Goal-WI B-5 Strategic Plan



The overarching goal of this initiative is to create a collaborative, ambitious, accountable, and achievable plan that connects, aligns, and strengthens the multiple, complex systems, services and supports that are necessary for building and sustaining a comprehensive and equitable B-5 system.





DCF Strategic Planning Process: ECAC Engagement



Outlines what you need to begin the strategic planning process. Identifies the responsibilities you have from gathering the tools to identifying the team and support needed to accomplish this task.



Refines the mission and core values, identifies the vision, collects relevant data from a variety of sources, and assesses all factors that should influence the strategic plan.



Constructs the skeleton of the strategic plan, including the identification of goals, outcomes, and strategies that will lead to the development of your objectives.



Manage

Implements and actively manages the strategic plan, consistent with our performance management framework



Align

Executes the communication plan, cascades the outcomes down to lower levels, and aligns plans from across the organization.



Refines how you will implement the plan by measuring progress toward your goals. Defines objectives and develops metrics; sets targets for those metrics and choose which metrics will become KPIs.

Next Steps: Strategic Plan


- Scheduling ad-hoc Strategic Planning meetings for ECAC members beginning in August
