Immunization Clinic Services

Cost and Availability

For children (18 years of age or younger)

The MHD can only provide vaccinations to children (18 years of age or younger) who meet one of the following criteria:

- Child is uninsured (no medical insurance)
- Child is enrolled in or eligible for Medicaid/BadgerCare
- Child is native American or Alaskan native

Vaccine provided through federal funding is free for those that are eligible. Children not eligible to receive federally funded vaccine from MHD must see their health care provider to receive vaccinations. Immunization services generally do not have associated co-pay or deductible fees applied to the receipt of immunization services. Clients with insurance should contact their insurance carriers to assess their co-payment and/or deductible fees.

For adults (anyone 19 or older)

MHD offers Influenza and pneumococcal vaccinations at MHD walk-in clinics, while supplies last. Call (414) 286-8034 to check for vaccine availability, and current fees.

Adults with health insurance will be directed to their primary health care provider.

Flu Vaccination Clinics

Flu Immunizations are provided free of charge ONLY to eligible children (Age 18 and under) who have BadgerCare+, Medicaid, or who are uninsured at any Milwaukee Health Department Walk-in Clinic. Call (414) 286-8034 to check for flu vaccine availability.

Children with private insurance or adults age 19 and older who do not have Medicaid will be charged a \$30.00 fee for influenza shots.
